Location and How to Reach Us:

The Center is conveniently accessible by private and public transportation.

1. Clinical and Healthcare Activities:

- a. Clinical diagnosis and testological assessment of Neuropsychiatric Disorders in developmental age conducted following existing guidelines by a multidisciplinary team.
- b. Individual and small group rehabilitative interventions (speech therapy, neuro and psychomotor therapy, cognitive enhancement interventions, communication interventions) for Neurodevelopmental Disorders in preschool age (Specific Language Disorders and Communication Disorders, Motor Coordination Disorders, Autism Spectrum Disorders, Intellectual Disabilities).
- c. Individual and small group rehabilitative interventions (speech therapy, neuro and psychomotor therapy, cognitive enhancement interventions, learning interventions) for Neurodevelopmental Disorders in school age (Specific Learning Disorders, Attention Deficit/Hyperactivity Disorders).
- d. Psychotherapeutic interventions and individual psychological support for children and adolescents with Psychopathological Disorders (Anxiety Disorders, Mood Disorders, Eating Disorders, Oppositional Defiant Disorders) isolated or in association with other NPI disorders.
- e. Psychological support interventions for parents of patients with NPI disorders.
- f. Individual and group parent training and parent coaching interventions, for patients with NPI disorders.
- g. Pedagogical counseling for Teachers of children and adolescents with NPI disorders in clinical care at the Center.

2. Provision and Access to Services

- a. Booking appointments is necessary and can be done by phone, email, or directly at the facility. The diagnostic process starts with the visit of the Child Neuropsychiatrist, who formulate a diagnostic hypotheses, defines the evaluation path and the specialists involved. At the end of the process, the Child Neuropsychiatrist will discuss with parents and children/adolescents the emerging diagnosis and the intervention recommendations.
- b. To access rehabilitative/psychotherapeutic treatments, it is necessary to create an Individual Rehabilitative Project (IRP), where objectives, interventions, timings, monitoring of the evolution of the disorder and verification methods are specified. Treatments are provided by an interdisciplinary team to ensure coordinated and integrated services.

3. Patient Discharge

At the end of the diagnostic process, a conclusive report is issued containing the results of the evaluations, the diagnosis, and intervention recommendations. At the end of the therapeutic process, a conclusive report is issued describing the completed therapeutic path, achieved results, as well as indications for any prosecution of interventions. Documents are prepared by the responsible physician along with the specialists of the team involved in the patient's management.

4. Payment for Services

Payments can be made in cash, by bank transfer, or debit/credit cards. Administrative staff is available for any clarification.

5. Access to Documentation

Patients (parents or legal guardians of minors) can access their data and obtain a copy of their clinical documentation (medical record or IRP) by making a specific request at the reception. A copy of the requested documentation will be prepared as soon as possible and can be collected at the reception desk during normal opening hours.

6. Informed Consent

At the beginning of the clinical path, parents (or guardians) are required to give consent for sensitive data processing in accordance with Legislative Decree 196/03 "Personal Data Protection Code." Professional confidentiality is ensured regarding all private and personal information that may arise during the clinical activities.
